Family Focuses on Education

The Phylcia Adele Williams Scholarship Fund was established in 1989 to honor the memory of Lisa, the daughter of Phyllis Williams and Bob Williams, granddaughter of Mae and Arthur Williams, who died in an automobile accident in November, 1988. Lisa was a freshman at North Carolina State University in Raleigh, North Carolina.

Scholarships are given to family members who graduate from high school the year prior to the family reunion and will be attending a two- or four-year institution the next fall.

Bob's vision was that family members would contribute to the scholarship fund and the sale of the t-shirts would supplement the fund. Because of the expense of the t-shirts and the desire to keep the cost low, the funds have been low. The smallest scholarship given was \$80 and the largest has been \$750.
